We also have a shop and a cafe.

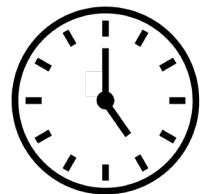
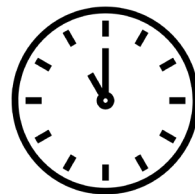


We are closed on Mondays.

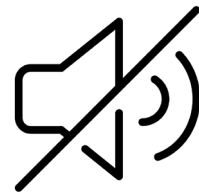
MONDAY:

and Information Desk.**



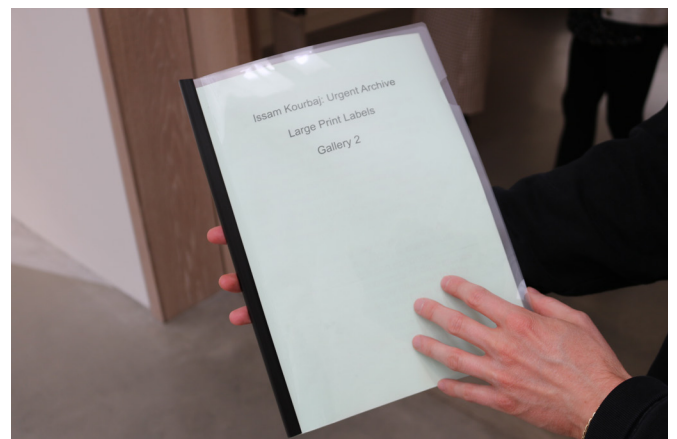
**It is sometimes busy

Bags and large coats are not allowed inside the house, because there are artworks on display.



Our staff members will look after your bag in a cupboard.



This is where you can hang your coat.

A member of staff can assist you with this if needed.



You can take bags and coats into the galleries.



Information about the house

If you visit the house, a Visitor Assistant will take you in with a small group of other people.



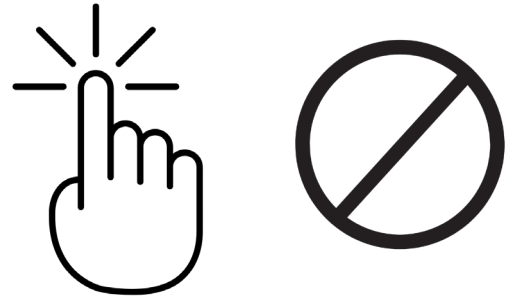
They will give you an introduction to the house and its history.



You will see lots of objects, furniture, paintings, sculptures and plants.



You can sit on the chairs, but please don't touch the objects or art.



If you have any questions or need any help whilst you're in the house, someone with a green lanyard will be happy to talk to you.



There are lots of stairs throughout Kettle's Yard, including a spiral staircase.

There is an alternative way in to the accessible part of the house.

Information about the galleries

There are two big galleries.

You can look at the art and talk about it.



The galleries have different art in them every few months.

You can call us or check our website to find out what is in them when you visit.



You can use stairs or a ramp to get to the galleries.



Information about the Clore Learning Studio

This is the Clore Learning Studio.



You can access this by stairs or the lift.



Sometimes there are events or workshops here.



It can be busy and noisy.



Information about the cafe

This is our cafe.

**It is open Tuesday to Sunday,
from 10.30am to 4.30pm.**

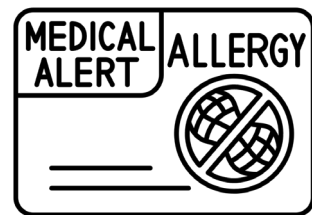
**There are stairs to the counter,
but there is an accessible part
of the cafe with a bell and a
member of staff can come and
take your order.**



**It can be busy and noisy with
people and coffee machines.**



**Let our café staff know if you
have any allergies.**



**Free tap water is accessible at
the entrance of the cafe.**



The cafe is card-only.



Information about the shop

This is our shop.

It is usually very bright and colourful.



The card terminal is remote and can be handed to you.



Both the café and shop have quite limited floor space, so queues can restrict manoeuvrability.



Accessibility

To get upstairs in Kettle's Yard, you can use stairs or a lift.



There is a mirror in the lift for ease of reversing out.



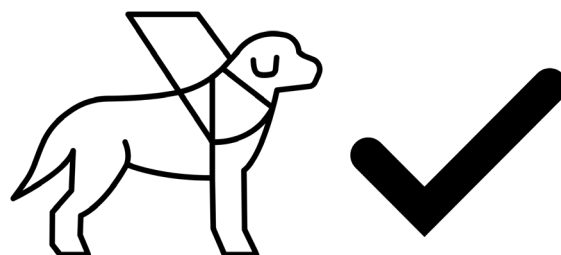
There are wheelchair accessible toilets on the ground floor, the first floor and in the Clore Learning Studio.

Our toilets are gender neutral, you can use any toilet.

There are automatic taps and paper towels to dry your hands.



You are welcome to bring your assistance animals to Kettle's Yard. Please see our website for more information on this.



Other spaces at Kettle's Yard

This is our Research Space on the first floor.

It looks different every few months.

You can look at objects and read books here.

Sometimes there are films playing.



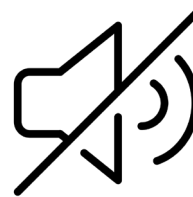
This is the Ede Room on the second floor.
